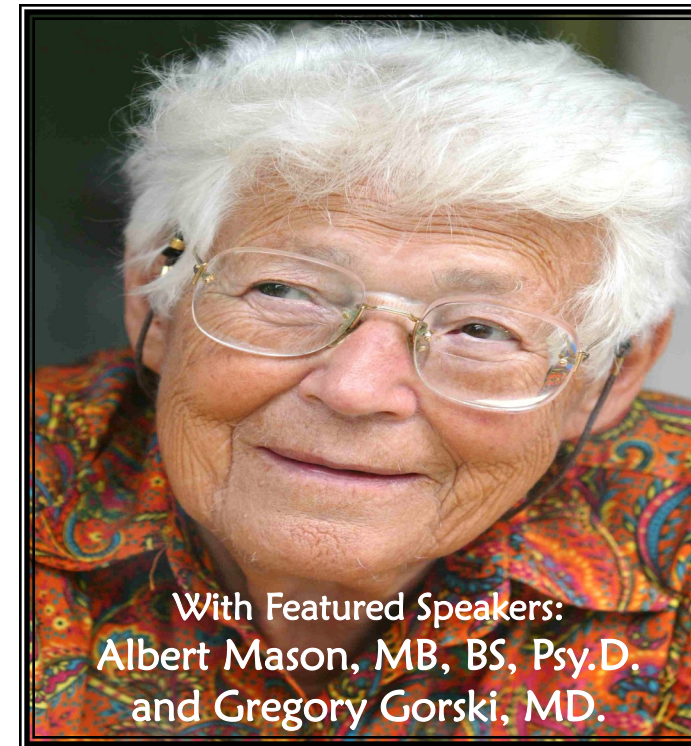

## HANNA SEGAL CONTRIBUTIONS TO PSYCHOANALYSIS

This half-day Memorial Conference focuses on some of the contributions of Hanna Segal, one of the most influential thinkers in contemporary psychoanalysis. In this conference, organized to celebrate and honor her work, we will hear two papers that highlight Dr. Segal's contributions and see a video presentation of Dr. Segal reading her last paper on dreams entitled: *Interpretation of Dreams: 100 Years After*.

Hanna Segal's contributions to psychoanalysis have been wide and prolific, spanning the understanding of Kleinian theory and technique, psychotic states of mind, aesthetics, modern literature, and man's need for warfare. Our first speaker, Dr. Albert Mason, will recount a short personal history of Segal and discuss her beginnings as a patient of Melanie Klein and a Training Analyst at The British Institute. He will then present an overview of her extensive contributions to psychoanalytic theory and practice with particular emphasis on art, literature, and aesthetics; her thoughts on the nature of symbols and symbolism; and her extension of Freud's concept of the death instinct. Segal's pioneering work in the analytic treatment of psychosis is described with the attendant implications for the understanding of psychotic mechanisms in all patients. Her views on the dynamics of envy, aggressivity, and destructiveness will be discussed for their significance in the life of the individual psyche as well as in world affairs. Her thoughts on countertransference and cure are also elaborated.

Our second speaker, Dr. Greg Gorski, will give an account of both the theoretical and clinical implications of what he describes as Dr. Segal's intention to incorporate Bion's theory of *container-contained* into the body of Kleinian metapsychology. He will discuss Segal's elaboration and refinement of Bion's concept as well as the clinical importance of her ideas. According to Segal, once one is attuned to this phenomenon, it can be frequently observed in sessions as a psychological process of great significance. Dr. Gorski will illustrate his ideas with clinical material from actual supervisions with Dr. Segal.

## SPEAKERS

**Albert Mason, MB, BS, Psy.D., F. Inst. Psychoanal.**, trained at The British Institute of Psychoanalysis and immigrated to the United States in 1969 with Wilfred Bion and Susanna Isaacs to further the work of Melanie Klein. Formerly Clinical Professor of Psychiatry at The University of Southern California, Dr. Mason is a Training and Supervising Analyst at The Psychoanalytic Center of California and The New Center for Psychoanalysis in Los Angeles. He has published and taught extensively both here and abroad, is a founding member and twice President of PCC, a founding Board member of CIPS, and a past member of The House of Delegates of The International Psychoanalytic Society. Dr. Mason served as Chair of the Klein Today Panel at the 2011 IPA Congress in Mexico City and maintains a private practice in Beverly Hills.

**Gregory Gorski, MD, F. Inst. Psychoanal.**, is a Training and Supervising Analyst and member of the Faculty at The Psychoanalytic Center of California. Dr. Gorski trained at The British Institute of Psychoanalysis and while in London served as Consultant Psychiatrist at the Tavistock Clinic Adolescent Department. He is a Past President of PCC and is in private practice in Pasadena.
